What is a character?

In a narrative, they are WHO performs the action or has the action happen to them.

What is a setting?

In a narrative, setting applies to the WHERE and WHEN.

Ambience, atmosphere and mood are all functions of setting.

What is a plot?

The WHAT HAPPENS in a narrative.

The basic story-line of a narrative.

The **literal** meaning as written in the story, without adding any additional level of understanding.

What is a Protagonist?

Central male or female character, usually a good person.

These are people who exhibit all those wonderful qualities to which we all aspire: honesty, integrity, kindness, courage, chivalry, gallantry, love, generosity (especially in spirit), etc.

What is an Antagonist?

Traditionally defined as an opponent.

In a narrative, the antagonist is the "bad guy". He is pitted against the protagonist. They usually have very few redeeming features.

What are Themes?

Themes are the fundamental and often universal ideas explored in a narrative.

A theme is the central idea or argument.

Texts are supposed to have a broad idea or issue that the composer was attempting to either to teach the reader or increase the reader's awareness.

What are Motifs?

Motifs are recurring structures, contrasts or literary devices that can help to develop and inform the major text themes.

A motif can be an object or image, which is consistently mentioned throughout a text.
